BACKGROUND:

On May 30, 2019, a rupture was discovered in the District's Moore Siphon causing water deliveries to cease to the Moore System – the Alder, Moore, Maple, Ross, and South Fork Canals. District staff notified all water customers of the disruption in service and immediately began working to determine the scope of the problem and to identify an interim patch repair and a long-term solution. General Manager O'Halloran declared an emergency on May 30, 2019, and District staff notified state and federal agencies of the emergency activities for permitting the repair and replacement of the siphon.

Staff will provide an update on general replacement activities related to the Moore Siphon.

BACKGROUND:

Point Blue Conservation Science (Point Blue) is a leader in climate-smart conservation and helps ensure that wildlife and communities continue to thrive in the decades to come. Their mission is to conserve birds, other wildlife and ecosystems through science, partnerships, and outreach.

Corey Shake is a Partner Biologist for the Rangeland Watershed Initiative where he works with landowners and livestock producers to improve ecosystem health on private range land. He covers Yolo County and works out of the Natural Resource Conservation Science (NRCS) office in Woodland. Corey provides conservation planning assistance aimed at benefitting fish and wildlife habitat and ecosystem function; and he conducts bird and wildlife surveys, vegetation measurements, and habitat assessment on the ranches of participating landowners.

Kristin Sesser is an Avian Ecologist and her work is focused on creating and enhancing waterbird habitat in the agricultural landscape of the Central Valley. She leads the Wildlife-Friendly Working Lands Initiative of the Migratory Bird Conservation Partnership where Point Blue works alongside The Nature Conservancy and Audubon California.

Corey and Kristin work on projects that improve water management for birds in ricefields and restore native habitat for beneficial insects. They will provide the Board with an overview of their work at Point Blue and potential collaboration efforts with the District.
